Project Goal	The overall aim of this project is to support the establishment of a fully biologically representative, climate change resilient, and functional Marine Protected Areas (MPA) Network based on the Global Island Partnership commitments and initially focused on Global Environment Facility (GEF) supported projects in the Caribbean region.
Expected Outcomes	 Enhanced coherence and financial sustainability of a large-scale transboundary (national and ecoregional) Caribbean MPA Network consistent with international GLISPA commitments; Regional network of MPA sites sharing and collaborating on common issues; MPA regional database to support national MPA decision-making; Improved capacity of MPA practitioners for more effective MPA management.
Components & Proposed Activities	 Assist countries with the development of their national MPA networks and support, where feasible, the development of subregional and transboundary representative biological networks and/or corridors; Enhance capacity for effective MPA management, including targeted training courses, exchanges, mentorships and site visits addressing common needs and issues of Caribbean MPAs (including, where appropriate, sites from other regions within the GLISPA objectives); Convene Annual Caribbean Challenge Regional Coordination Meeting to agree on common approaches for MPA development and management, including for MPA networks; Establish regular regional communications system, including communication tools and publications; Harmonise ecological and socioeconomic monitoring and indicators for MPA effectiveness (including consideration to global efforts such as GLISPA); Data collection, analysis and MPA status reports through a regional MPA database to support national mechanisms for MPA decision-making; Lessons learned made available through posting and dissemination for replication to other participating countries and other regions.
