

#### Other legal designations

Fisheries Act 5914 of May 22, 1962; Decreee no. 316 of October 14, 1986 that closed lobters' (Panulirus argus, P. guttatus, and Scyllarides) fishing from April 1 to July 1, and size limits; Decree 320 of October 14, 1986 establishes that coastal resources are protected by the Department of Agriculture; Decree 312 of October 14, 1986 establishes size limits, posession and selling of queen conch (Strombus gigas) and burgao; Decree 313 of October 14, 1986 prohibits selling of marine species: barracuda, Medregal and Peje Rey; Decree 317 of Octubre 14, 1986 establishes closure of male and female crabs harvesting from December 1 to April 1, and prohibits harvest of female crabs from June 1 to August 30.
