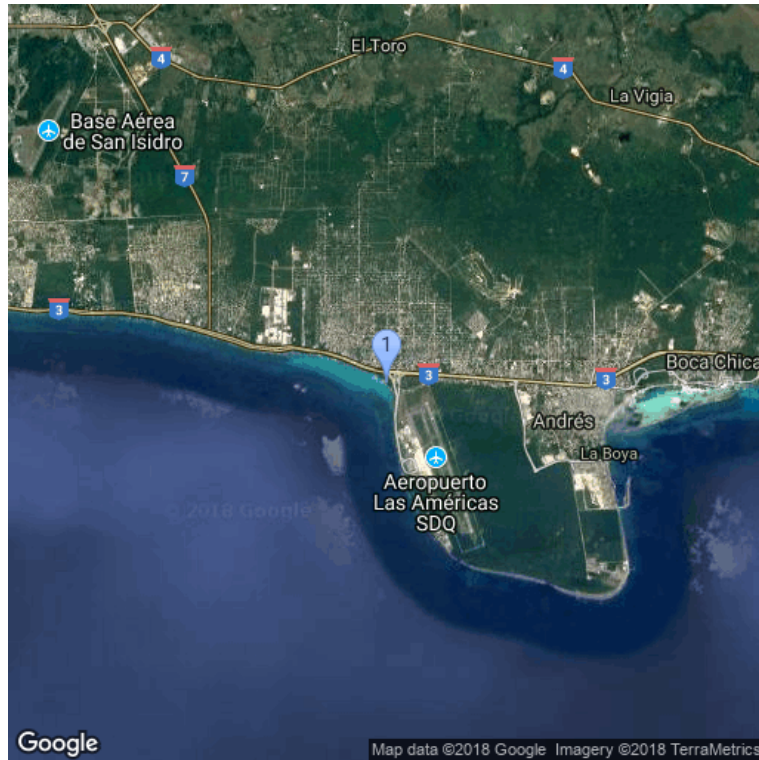

Fisheries Act 5914 of May 22, 1962; Decree no. 316 of October 14, 1986 that closed lobsters' (*Panulirus argus*, *P. guttatus*, and *Scyllarides*) fishing from April 1 to July 1, and size limits; Decree 320 of October 14, 1986 establishes that coastal resources are protected by the Department of Agriculture; Decree 312 of October 14, 1986 establishes size limits, possession and selling of queen conch (*Strombus gigas*) and burgao; Decree 313 of October 14, 1986 prohibits selling of marine species: barracuda, Medregal and Peje Rey; Decree 317 of October 14, 1986 establishes closure of male and female crabs harvesting from December 1 to April 1, and prohibits harvest of female crabs from June 1 to August 30.
